Promise of Self-Service BI (SSBI)

BUSINESS USERS

Empowered to get all data necessary to make decisions, at the speed of Business





IT

- Able to eliminate BI backlogs;
- Focus on more complex BI solutions and on things they haven't been able to focus on





Governance Dilemma of SSBI

IT-LED (Traditional) BI

- Does not deliver fast enough
- Not responsive enough
- Much easier to govern

SSBI

- Delivers faster
- Responsive to changing business requirements
- Very hard to govern

Shadow IT





SSBI applications can multiply like rabbits and proliferate "shadow IT" environments. Except now these shadow IT BI apps are not based on spreadsheets but on a new breed of SSBI tools. (Forrester, 2017)

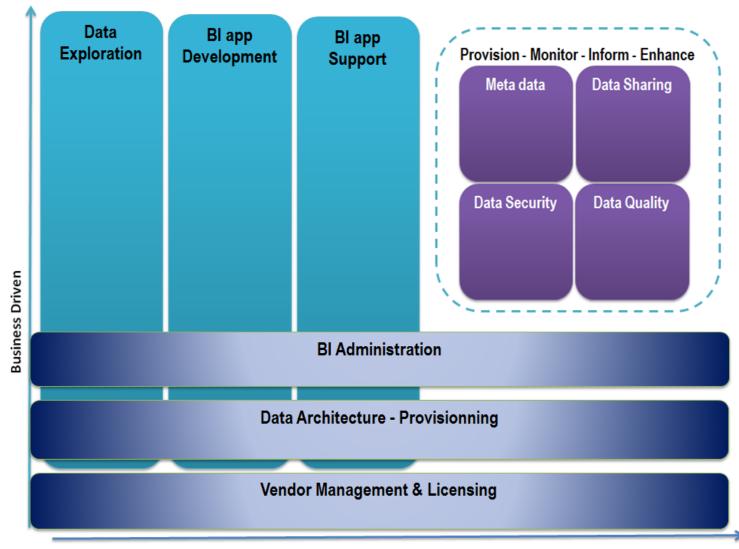


Balancing act between enabling SSBI and protecting business information, achieved through a governance model based on 'shared responsibility'

SSBI is not always end-to-end SSBI - Not all Business Users want to go through the entire cycle
